- Health and welfare (dealing with your medical and care issues).

Court of Protection

If you leave it too late, your relatives can apply to the Court of Protection for a deputyship order. Unfortunately, this process is both costly and time-consuming. In turn it will remove the need for a deputyship order to be sought through the Court of Protection and the extra administrative burden which is placed on appointments through the Court over and above the standard process required through appointments granted under a Lasting Power of Attorney.
